SIR MOTI TIKARAM MEMORIAL LECTURE

"The People's Universit



The University of Fiji will host the 6th Sir Moti Tikaram Memorial Lecture on Friday, 27 September, 2019.

Brief Background on Sir Moti Tikaram: Sir Moti Tikaram, KBE, CF, LLB (NZ) (18 March 1925 – 17 May 2012) was an outstanding citizen of Fiji. He was born a British subject in colonial times; and became a long time Commonwealth citizen. Sir Tikaram was a judge of the Supreme Court of Fiji, the first Ombuds-man of independent Fiji and a football administrator. He was the first local person to be appointed to the Supreme Court of Fiji.

He also served a wider world. He advanced the principles of universal human rights, justice and the rule of law. His able discharge of diverse public duties in Fiji was recognised by the Queen in 1980 when he was bestowed Knight Commander of the Order of the British Empire (KBE). In 1985, he was elected by the International Commission of Jurists (ICJ) to be the first Commissioner chosen from Fiji. In 1993, he became Acting President of the Fiji Court of Appeal and served as Acting Chief Justice of Fiji on mary occasions.

The Government of India conferred on him the Hind Rattan Award and, in January 2007, the President of India conferred the Parvasi Bharatiya Samman Award. In 2009, he was awarded the "Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel Award" in New Delhi, India at the Indian Diaspora Celebrations.

UniFiji Signs MoU with Pacific Islands Development Forum (PIDF) and United Nations Office of the High Commissioner for Human **Rights (OHCHR)**

The University of Fiji's Acting Vice-Chancellor, Professor Subramani signed Memorandum of Understanding а (MoU) with the United Nations Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) and Pacific Island Development Forum (PIDF) on Thursday, July 18, 2019.

The MoU is in relations to the Justice Devendra Pathik School of Law (JDP SoL's) Institute of Human Rights Research (IHRR) which was also launched at the signing ceremony. The focus of the Institute is to carry out cutting-edge and policy-oriented research and analysis in human rights.

Giving his keynote address, Speaker of Parliament of Fiji and Chancellor of The University of Fiji, Ratu Epeli Nailatikau, said the Institute was an important initiative of The University of Fiji and its partners and stated that change brought about by the research and policy could take many forms.

These included removing discrimination in laws and policies, improving the practices of law enforcement and government officials, promoting better

ways of doing business, and challenging negative stereotypes about vulnerable groups in the community.

"However, it is long term work and requires everyone to get involved and who will work as partners- civil society organisations, governments and international organisations- to help build communities where human rights of all people are respected, protected and fulfilled. Which is why this partnership is important-while the academia focus on the research, the development organisations focus on the applicability of the research blending this with international practice and experiences. Research done through this institute should be done with the aim to inform national policy and review laws," he explained.

Dean of JDP SoL, Professor Shaista Shameem explained that the Institute would provide a deeper understanding of human rights norms.

She mentioned that the Institute aimed to facilitate a rigorous exchange of ideas where both practical human rights work and new approaches to policy would be debated and analyzed in an environment

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of collegiality and common purposenot only to understand the world, but to transform it for the public good.

She said that the MoU represented a milestone for the University.

"The University of Fiji's Strategic Plan states that the University's work includes being the critic and conscience of society and thus we see this Institute as epitomizing for us that progressive KPI; not only that, but it will employ academic freedom, which is protected by a special provision in the University of Fiji Act, in achieving it," she said.

July 18 is also known as Mandela Day, in memory of Nelson Madela, one of the pioneers of human rights advocacy in the world.

His Excellency, Bingo Thamanga, Chargé d'Affaires, South African High Commission to Fiji said that the late Mandela personified human rights and the struggle for justice and equality for all.

He also said that Mandela embodied the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the Vienna Declaration and Programme of Action, including the 9 core human treaties.

"As our greatest human rights champion of our time, the late Mandela cherished, lived and was prepared to die for an ideal world of democracy, human rights, social justice and equality for all. He exuded paramount values of compassion of compassion, love, forgiveness, forgetting, healing, reconciliation, peace, dialogue, unity, solidarity, fairness and shared prosperity. As the South African Commission, we fully embrace the launch of this Research Institute, which undoubtedly destined to provide a pedestal for the cutting edge research in the Pacifica," he concluded.

Those attending the MOU Ceremony were members of the diplomatic corps, NGOs and academics. Professor Shameem said the University was fortunate to have attracted the partnership of the PIDF and OHCHR to this initiative and the JDP School of Law looks forward to working closely with both the partners to produce world class research in human rights.

The University of Fiji's Acting Vice-Chancellor, Professor Subramani's novel Fiji *Maa; Mother of a Thousand,* 2018 was launched on July 15, 2019 during the inaugural International Conference on Forced Labour hosted at the Saweni Campus. The renowned author spent 14 years researching and writing this astonishing novel in Fiji Hindi.

He described the 1026 pages long novel as not only being a novel but also an archival work which can be read as a 'dictionary' of Fiji Hindi.

"It begins about 1940s and arrives at the contemporary period and many things change during that period- the language changes, the way people dress changes, technology changes, transport, house, clothing, entertainment, and more. And when we are writing a novel, in the background you have to keep all that in mind. To write an epic novel like that is an obsession. It is dedicated work, digging deep into your memory, defining not only the characters, but looking into yourself dredging out all the residual substance," he explained. wrote.

Furthermore he wrote "These narrations of her life story are scattered with histories of a nolonger-existing rural life and its people. The novel can be explored using various themes, including women's emancipation, subaltern history, the global extension of Mother India, lost rural life of the remote islands, Indian culture in a foreign land and the trauma of forced migration."

This 1026 pages long novel is published by The University of the South Pacific Press. It is available at the USP Bookshop and at the Enlightenment Book Centre at The University of Fiji. The book will be launched in Bhopal and New Delhi in November, 2019.

UniFiji to Inaugurate an Institute of Hindi Language & Culture Studies

With rapid loss of culture, traditions and language which accompanies the modern

era, keeping them alive is our great challenge. It is a grave concern that the students taking Hindi is declining at all levels, and the knowledge of Devanagri is rapidly fading.

The University of Fiji, which we call People's University, has taken action to reverse this trend. It has established the Institute of Hindi Language and Culture Studies. The Institute incorporates Hindi Studies, Centre for Diaspora Studies and the Rabindranath Tagore Centre. This complements the work done by the Centre of iTaukei Studies.

The Institute's primary objective is to promote the learning of Hindi Language and keep alive relevant values and traditions. The Institute is also the repository of Hindi and Literature and will promote writings in Hindi language. The Institute will have an Acting Director until full term Director is appointed.

The Acting Director will have three main responsibilities: Strengthen the study of Hindi at The University of Fiji; revitalize the Centre for Diaspora Studies and the Tagore Centre and negotiate with benefactors to set a sound foundation for the continuity of the Institute.

Hindi Studies commenced at the University in 2008 with an amalgamation of language and culture and has progressed satisfactorily thereafter. The Department offers Diploma in Hindi Language and Indian Culture; Bachelor of Arts, single major; Bachelor of Arts, double major; Postgraduate Diploma in Hindi Literature and Master of Arts in Hindi.

The Centre of Diaspora Studies was established with the objective of encouraging learning and scholarship on the Fijian diaspora and to promote interaction at various levels between the diaspora and homeland.

The Rabindranath Tagore Centre was established with the objective to stimulate students' interest in humanistic perspective in understanding works of literature, including the works of Tagore.

The Acting Vice-Chancellor, Professor Subramani, said the Institute of Hindi Language and Culture would contribute to our ambitious goal of making The University of Fiji the intellectual and cultural centre of Western Viti Levu.

Community Relations- New Direction for University Promotions

Plastic – A Growing Concern in the Pacific

Plastic problem is a worldwide challenge. In the Pacific Islands, the plastic problem is rising and causing serious concerns. The plastic thrown away by people even on the streets gets washed away and end up in the Oceans threatening the livelihood of the marine organisms. Globally, there is limited data on plastic debris and its impacts on the marine ecosystems.

Mr. Anish Maharaj from the School of Science and Technology, together with other researchers have compiled a research paper

titled "Plastic debris on Pacific Islands: Ecological and health implications".

The research aimed to address the need for more research through a systematic assessment of the ecological and health impacts of plastic debris on Pacific Islands.

The study identified pollution and contamination trends and risks to ecosystems, and suggested some measures which may be deployed to address the identified problems using pertinent historical qualitative and quantitative data of the distribution of plastic debris in the region.

The study illustrated the fact that Pacific Island Countries were disproportionately affected by plastic, and reiterates that further studies and integrated strategies were needed, involving public education and empowerment, governmental action, as well as ecologically sustainable industry leadership, and focusing on manufacturing and using fully biodegradable plastic.

Science Academics' Research Published in A Ranking Journal

The University of Fiji's Science academics in collaboration with researchers from the College of Marine Science, University of

The purpose of the study carried out was to develop a baseline habitat map of the intertidal benthic cover in Komave Village, Coral Coast, Sigatoka, Fiji.

A community participatory research approach was used to conduct interviews to assimilate information on fishing sites and coastal land use activities. The exercise explored the social-ecological approach in natural resource management and how it could become an important tool in coastal conservation practices.

The coastal resource map generated through the study would serve as a baseline for monitoring the status and spatial distribution of the coastal resources in Komave.

This high resolution map is particularly relevant to Fiji as it is the first of its kind for the country. This work also serves to reduce the global information gap of coastal resource status for Fiji.
