Programme Aim and Objectives

This programme introduces and consolidates fundamental Public Health and Primary Health Care Concepts and is designed for health professionals from a broad range of backgrounds and disciplines. Students will define, assess critically and resolve public health and community problems.

Furthermore, the course will cater significant range of in -country and international health services that will enhance professional competence, values and behaviors that are inherent to the discipline of Public Health.

The programme will enhance the skills of critical reflection and assessment of professional activities, enabling one to meet the changing health needs of the populace, families, and communities in various settings, and the changing demands of health care in modern societies; using a range of detailed measures to impart and enhance knowledge in Public health generally and social aspects of health, illness and disease.

Duration: 3 years (FULL TIME).

Entry Requirement

- A. Pass in Year 13 with 2 Science Subjects and 50% in English.
- B. Mature Entry at least 1 year working in any field of medicine or health, premature exit from MBBS or other Sciences from universities or Allied Health equivalent from listing at end of document and in any Health Sciences.
- C. Foundation course; GPA of 2.5 and above with at least 2 science subjects and no repeats.
- D. Graduate entry: science or medical related degree with aggregate GPA of 2.5 and above.
